## **REPORT TO CONGRESS**

## NURSE CORPS LOAN REPAYMENT AND SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS FISCAL YEAR 2022

## **Executive Summary**

The Nurse Corps Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs report to Congress for fiscal year (FY) 2022 responds to section 846(h) of the Public Health Service Act, which states:

Not later than 18 months after August 1, 2002, and annually thereafter, the Secretary shall prepare and submit to the Congress a report describing the programs carried out under this section, including statements regarding—

- (1) the number of enrollees, scholarships, loan repayments, and grant recipients;
- (2) the number of graduates;
- (3) the amount of scholarship payments and loan repayments made;
- (4) which educational institution the recipients attended;
- (5) the number and placement location of the scholarship and loan repayment recipients at health care facilities with a critical shortage of nurses;
- (6) the default rate and actions required;
- (7) the amount of outstanding default funds of both the scholarship and loan repayment programs;
- (8) to the extent that it can be determined, the reason for the default;
- (9) the demographics of the individuals participating in the scholarship and loan repayment programs;
- (10) justification for the allocation of funds between the scholarship and loan repayment programs; and
- (11) an evaluation of the overall costs and benefits of the programs."

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) administers the Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program (LRP) and the Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (SP) to improve the distribution and supply of nurses. The Nurse Corps LRP and SP support nursing education and training by providing recruitment and retention incentives to nurses committed to a career in underserved communities. These incentives include either a loan repayment or a scholarship award in exchange for service as a nurse at an eligible health care facility with a critical shortage of nurses (Critical Shortage Facility (CSF)) that is in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA), or a loan repayment award for service as nurse faculty at an eligible accredited school of nursing.

In FY 2022, Nurse Corps programs received \$88.6 million in annual appropriations. In addition, in FY 2021, the program received \$200 million in supplemental funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (Public Law 117-2) to support the nation's COVID-19 emergency response. Of the remaining American Rescue Plan Act supplemental funds, approximately \$88.2 million was obligated in FY 2022 and \$18.2 million in FY 2023. With the additional resources, in FY 2022 HRSA made a total of 2,871 new and continuation Nurse Corps awards to nurses and nursing students across 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. Additionally, HRSA was able to bolster the nursing workforce as follows:

- The Nurse Corps LRP received 5,419 new and continuation applications and made a total of 2,279 awards.
  - O HRSA made 2,022 LRP awards to nursing participants serving at CSFs, which includes 1,839 new and 183 continuation awards. Ninety-seven percent of LRP awards at CSF were in high-need HPSAs (defined as an area with a HPSA score 14 or higher) with an average HPSA score of 17 in FY 2022.
  - Additionally, HRSA made 257 awards to nurse faculty participants serving at a school of nursing, including 232 new and 25 continuation Nurse Corps LRP awards.
- The Nurse Corps SP received 2,291 new and continuation applications and made 592 total awards.
  - HRSA made 567 new and 25 continuation Nurse Corps SP awards to nursing students – all of whom met the expected family contribution eligibility of having the greatest financial need.

HRSA continues to make historic gains in the Nurse Corps field strength. As of September 30, 2022, the field strength increased by 56 percent (from 2,521 to 3,932 participants) including registered nurses and nurse faculty members fulfilling multi-year service commitments. Further, based on data collected by HRSA, 90 percent of Nurse Corps alumni who responded remained at a CSF for 2 years beyond the completion of their Nurse Corps service commitment.

## I. Statutory Language

Section 846(h) of the Public Health Service (PHS) Act requires that the Secretary provide a report to Congress. The PHS Act states:

"Not later than 18 months after August 1, 2002, and annually thereafter, the Secretary shall prepare and submit to the Congress a report describing the programs carried out under this section, including statements regarding—

- (1) the number of enrollees, scholarships, loan repayments, and grant recipients;
- (2) the number of graduates;
- (3) the amount of scholarship payments and loan repayments made;
- (4) which educational institution the recipients attended;
- (5) the number and placement location of the scholarship and loan repayment recipients at health care facilities with a critical shortage of nurses;
- (6) the default rate and actions required;
- (7) the amount of outstanding default funds of both the scholarship and loan repayment programs;
- (8) to the extent that it can be determined, the reason for the default;
- (9) the demographics of the individuals participating in the scholarship and loan repayment programs;
- (10) justification for the allocation of funds between the scholarship and loan repayment programs; and
- (11) an evaluation of the overall costs and benefits of the programs."

### II. Introduction

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) administers the Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program (LRP) and the Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (SP) to improve the distribution and supply of nursing graduates and professionals.

The Nurse Corps LRP is a financial incentive program in which registered nurses (RN) and advanced practice registered nurses (APRN), such as nurse practitioners (NP), with the greatest financial need enter into contracts with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to work full-time in an approved Critical Shortage Facility (CSF).<sup>3</sup> The LRP repays 60 percent of the outstanding principal and interest on the nursing education loans for participants in exchange for a 2-year service commitment. Participants may be eligible for an additional 25 percent repayment in exchange for an optional third year of full-time service.

The Nurse Corps LRP also makes awards to nurses to serve as faculty at accredited schools of nursing. HRSA provides the same loan repayment benefits to nurse faculty as program participants serving at a CSF. The awards aid in the recruitment and retention of nurse faculty

by decreasing economic barriers associated with pursuing a career in academia. Higher compensation in clinical and private sector settings can draw current and potential nurse educators from teaching.<sup>4</sup> In addition, the American Association of Colleges of Nursing expects the shortage of nurse faculty to increase as current nurse faculty retire.<sup>5</sup> The average ages of doctoral- and master's degree-prepared nurse faculty are 57 years and 54 years, respectively.<sup>6</sup>

The Nurse Corps SP reduces financial barriers to nursing education for all levels of professional nursing students. Qualified applicants with the greatest financial need receive a funding preference. HRSA pays tuition and eligible fees directly to the schools and other reasonable costs and a monthly stipend to individuals attending accredited schools of nursing in exchange for a 2-year minimum service commitment in a CSF post-graduation. The "other reasonable costs" is a single annual payment provided to the students to assist with the cost of books, clinical supplies/instruments, and uniforms, while the monthly stipend is to cover living expenses. In fiscal year (FY) 2022, stipends were \$1,466 per month.

The Nurse Corps LRP and Nurse Corps SP work to address the supply and distribution of nurses across the United States. Many factors affect the supply and demand of nurses, including population growth, the aging population and that of the nursing workforce, economic conditions, demand for health services broadly and within specific health care settings, and health care reimbursement.<sup>8</sup> In November 2022, HRSA's National Center for Health Workforce Analysis updated nursing workforce data projecting a national excess supply of approximately 16,180 full time equivalent RNs in 2035.<sup>9</sup> However, this projection assumes that historical patterns of attrition, graduation, and labor force participation remain the same over the forecasted period. With data evolving, it is important to note the National Center for Health Workforce Analysis generated these early projections using historical data through 2020 and the projections do not yet reflect the full impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the nursing workforce.

### III. Overview

HRSA establishes and publishes Nurse Corps program priorities annually in the Application and Program Guidance for each program. In FY 2022, HRSA set aside up to 50 percent of the Nurse Corps LRP and SP total annual appropriations to support NPs. Within the allocations for NPs, up to 20 percent of total annual appropriations was available for psychiatric NPs and the

remainder was available to all other NPs. The NP set-asides were implemented to expand efforts to address the opioid epidemic and other substance use disorders across the nation by supporting the behavioral health nursing workforce. To increase the number of NPs participating in the programs, the Nurse Corps LRP and SP actively recruited licensed NPs and individuals interested in pursuing training as an NP through outreach efforts to colleges, universities, and associations.

Additionally, for the FY 2022 Nurse Corps LRP and SP application cycle, both programs established set-aside funding of up to \$5 million to support women's health for applicants working in one of the following capacities: women's health NP, certified nurse midwife, or certified obstetrics-gynecology (OB/GYN) RN. In FY 2022, Nurse Corps LRP also set aside up to \$750,000 to support NPs, APRNs, or RNs working as Public Health Nurses. In addition, the Nurse Corps SP set aside up to \$2 million of FY 2022 funding to support "Career Pathways" students, who are entry-level health professionals seeking degrees to become a RN.

For the Nurse Corps LRP, applicants with the greatest financial need and who work in CSFs located in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) with scores of 14 or above receive funding preference. For the Nurse Corps Faculty LRP, preference is given to nurse faculty members with the greatest financial need working at schools of nursing with at least 50 percent enrollment of students from a disadvantaged background. An individual from a disadvantaged background is defined as a student who is considered economically disadvantaged or comes from an environment that has inhibited them from obtaining the knowledge, skills, and abilities required to enroll in and graduate from a health profession or nursing school (environmentally disadvantaged).

The Nurse Corps SP considers applicants with the greatest financial need, based on the applicant's expected family contribution as determined by the U.S. Department of Education, to receive a funding preference. For FY 2022, this preference included an expected family contribution between \$0 and \$5,846 annually. Among qualified applicants with the greatest financial need, HRSA makes awards considering the following:

- Enrollment or acceptance in an accredited diploma or undergraduate and graduate nursing program or an accredited graduate-level NP program, including NPs specializing in psychiatric mental health, with full-time or part-time registration for consecutive terms.
- Enrollment or acceptance in an accredited Doctor of Nursing Practice program, a program for certified nurse midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetists, clinical nurse specialists, or psychology specialists, with full-time registration for consecutive terms.

This report summarizes Nurse Corps LRP and Nurse SP activities for FY 2022 and provides information on the following, in accordance with Section 846(h) of the PHS Act:

- Number of enrollees, scholarships, loan repayments, and grant recipients;
- Number of graduates;
- Amount of scholarship awards and loan repayments made;
- Educational institution attended;
- Number and placement location of Nurse Corps LRP and SP recipients at CSFs;
- Default rate and actions required;
- Amount of outstanding default funds for both the Nurse Corps LRP and SP;

## IV. Report Requirements

## Requirement #1: The Number of Enrollees, Scholarships, Loan Repayments, and Grant Recipients

#### **Nurse Corps Field Strength**

There are over 3,932 Nurse Corps participants currently serving at approximately 2,536 CSFs. Nurse Corps participants provide care to 4.1 million patients annually in urban, rural, and tribal areas. About 21 percent of Nurse Corps clinicians work at a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC).<sup>12</sup>

Due to the addition of \$200 million in American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act funding, FY 2022 represented the Nurse Corps' highest field strength in the history of the programs. HRSA made 2,279 Nurse Corps LRP awards, including 2,071 new and 208 continuation awards from annual appropriations, and no new awards from recovered funds (Table 1). The 2,279 awards were provided to RNs (1,103 awards; 48 percent), NPs (753 awards; 33 percent), certified registered nurse anesthetists (135 awards; 6 percent), certified nurse midwives (29 awards; 1.3 percent), clinical nurse specialists (2 awards; 0.1 percent), and nurse faculty (257 awards; 11 percent). <sup>13</sup>

HRSA made Nurse Corps LRP ARP Act funded awards to nurses that specialize in Women's Health and Public Health.

HRSA made 592 Nurse Corps SP awards, including 567 new and 25 continuation awards from annual appropriations. HRSA made four new Nurse Corps SP awards with no-year funds (Table 2). The 592 awards were to associate degree students (63 awards; 10.6 percent), bachelor's degree students (278 awards; 47 percent), bachelor's accelerated students (151 awards; 25.5 percent), master's degree students (67 awards; 11.3 percent), Doctor of Nursing practice (28 awards; 4.7 percent), and nursing diploma students (five awards; 0.8 percent).

### **Requirement #2: The Number of Graduates**

Nurse Corps SP participants may enroll in diploma programs as well as accredited associate, bachelor's, and master's degree programs. The minimum service requirement is 2 years, with a maximum of 4 years of full-time service, in a CSF depending on the number of years of academic support. Participants can choose from 1 to 4 years of scholarship support, consisting of payments for tuition and fees, other reasonable costs, and a monthly stipend.

Nurse Corps SP participants may work part-time to fulfill their service obligation. However, HRSA will extend the service obligation years of service so that the aggregate amount of service

performed is equivalent to the full-time option. Nurse Corps SP graduates have up to 9 months from the date of graduation to obtain a nursing license, accept an offer of employment from a program-approved facility, and begin full-time or part-time clinical services at a CSF. The number of active Nurse Corps SP participants who graduated in FY 2022 is 332. Of those participants, 77 served in a CSF and 255 sought employment at a CSF. In FY 2022, 90 percent of Nurse Corps alumni remained at a CSF for 2 years beyond the completion of their Nurse Corps service commitment.

## Requirement #3: The Amount of Scholarship Payments and Loan Repayments Made

Table 3 below contains amounts paid for Nurse Corps LRP and SP new awards and continuations, funded from annual appropriations (base funds), ARP Act funds, and no-year funds.

## Requirement #4: The Educational Institutions Attended by Recipients<sup>15</sup>

Nurse Corps SP participants attended 469 schools in 45 states, including the District of Columbia (these numbers include all Nurse Corps scholars awarded in the prior FY). Appendix B illustrates the distribution of FY 2022 new awards by state and educational institution.

# Requirement #5: The Number and Placement Location of the Scholarship and Loan Repayment Recipients at Healthcare Facilities with a Critical Shortage of Nurses

Except for nurse faculty, all Nurse Corps LRP and SP participants are required to serve at a CSF. Nurse faculty participants must serve at an eligible accredited school of nursing. The following types of facilities are eligible CSFs for placement of Nurse Corps LRP and SP participants:

In FY 2022, 2,022 Nurse Corps LRP new and continuation awardees served in 1,220 CSFs in 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico (Appendix C); 257 nurse faculty new and continuation awardees served in 196 schools of nursing in 47 states and in the District of Columbia (Appendix D). In FY 2022, 77 Nurse Corps SP new graduates served in 61 CSFs in 28 states (Appendix A).

### Requirement #6: Default Rate and Actions Required

There were no defaults in FY 2022 for the Nurse Corps LRP and SP.

HRSA expresses the Nurse Corps LRP and SP default rates as the percentage of participants in a cohort (all participants with a new or continuation contract awarded in an FY) who default (number of participants who have defaulted divided by the total number of individuals in the cohort).<sup>19</sup> Individuals often participate for multiple years; however, HRSA calculates default

rates in the FY in which an individual received the initial award. Therefore, for any given cohort, the default rate for an FY may change over time.

The maximum amount of time a participant in full-time service may be in the Nurse Corps SP is 8 years – 4 years in school and 4 years of obligated service. The maximum amount of time a participant in full-time service may be in the Nurse Corps LRP is 3 years – 2 years of service under an initial contract and 1 optional year of service under a continuation. Participants with periods of approved suspension of service may require an additional 1 to 2 years of monitoring. Participants in the Nurse Corps SP wishing to serve part-time must obtain prior approval from Nurse Corps SP and must extend the service obligation to equal the full-time commitment. Thus, HRSA reports default rates over 10 years for the Nurse Corps SP and 5 years for the Nurse Corps LRP to provide an accurate picture of default rates. Historically, few to no defaults occur within the first year of the service obligation.

Participants who breach their contracts are placed in default and are liable to repay the Nurse Corps LRP or SP funds they received, plus interest, from the date of the default, which is defined as the date the participant breached the Nurse Corps contract service obligation or, for scholars still in school, the date they left their educational program as described in section 846(g)(1)(A) of the PHS Act. Participants must pay the total amount owed, including interest, within 3 years of the date of default. The interest rate is the maximum legal prevailing rate for the applicable quarter determined and fixed by the Secretary of the Treasury after taking into consideration private consumer rates of interest. The Nurse Corps LRP and SP work with participants placed in default by helping them to satisfy their debts through service when possible. In FY 2022, HRSA granted 12 participants previously in default an opportunity to return to service. Of those 12 participants, two participants were from the Nurse Corps LRP, five participants were from the Nurse Corps SP, and five participants remained in default.

As of September 30, 2022, there were 153 defaults in the Nurse Corps SP from FY 2012 to FY 2022.

## Requirement #7: Amount of Outstanding Default Funds of Both the Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs

Section 846(g)(4) of the PHS Act authorizes amounts recovered from participants who breach their Nurse Corps LRP or SP contract to be made available for the respective program until expended. HRSA uses these funds for new awards, continuations, and modifications to existing contracts. In FY 2022, the Nurse Corps LRP added \$417,643 to its no-year account and closed the FY with a net amount of \$417,643 as Nurse Corps LRP did not make any awards from the no-year account. In FY 2022, the Nurse Corps SP added \$508,982 to its no-year account and closed the FY with a net amount of \$220,738.

As of September 30, 2022, the total outstanding default debt was \$2,888,678 for the Nurse Corps LRP and \$16,426,836 for the Nurse Corps SP.

### **Requirement #8: The Reasons for the Default**

Recognizing there were no defaults in FY 2021 or FY 2022, the most common reasons for default in the Nurse Corps SP are that participants fail to complete their service obligation (51 percent), receive an academic dismissal (19 percent), or withdraw from school (12 percent).

Recognizing there were no defaults in FY 2022, the most common reason for default in the Nurse Corps LRP in FY 2021 was a failure to complete the service obligation after a participant's resignation from an approved CSF (61 percent).

## Requirement #9: The Demographics of the Individuals Participating in the Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs

Nurse Corps LRP and SP participants self-report demographic data. Of the Nurse Corps participants who reported on sex, race, and ethnicity, the most reported sex was female, and the most reported ethnicity was white. Black or African American was the largest reported minority group demographic (Table 8). HRSA requests Hispanic/Latino and Non-Hispanic/Non-Latino ethnicity data in the electronic application separately from sex and race data. Applicants may choose to report on any of these demographic areas in whole or in part. As a result, Hispanic/Latino and Non-Hispanic/Non-Latino data may be over-reported as this information is the only metric for capturing ethnicity.

## Requirement #10: Justification for the Allocation of Funds between the Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs

Historically, HRSA has allocated total Nurse Corps funds at 67 to 75 percent for the LRP and 25 to 33 percent for the SP. In addition to ARP Act funding from FY 2021, in FY 2022, the Nurse Corps programs received \$88.6 million in annual appropriations. Of the \$88.6 million in annual appropriations, HRSA allocated \$76.3 million for the Nurse Corps LRP and SP awards, consisting of \$52 million for LRP awards (68 percent of HRSA allocation) and \$24.3 million for SP awards (32 percent of HRSA allocation). The remaining \$12.3 million directly supported the Nurse Corps programs in the form of staffing and acquisition contracts, including the electronic system used to process program applications and monitor awarded participants, tax withholding and reporting, and other administrative obligations. With additional ARP Act funding in FY 2022, the Nurse Corps programs supported the nation's COVID-19 emergency response.

## Requirement #11: An Evaluation of the Overall Costs and Benefits of the Programs

Analysis of costs per years of service:

#### (1) FY 2022 Nurse Corps LRP Awards

In FY 2022, HRSA made 2,071 new awards, representing a 66.2 percent increase from the 1,246 new awards made in FY 2021. This growth in awards was due to additional program funding provided in the ARP Act. The average new award amount for Nurse Corps LRP participants was \$37,725 for non-faculty and \$40,157 for nurse faculty. This is a 50 percent decrease in the average new award amount for non-faculty participants and a 47 percent decrease in the average new award amount for nurse faculty participants from FY 2021 to 2022. Since Nurse Corps LRP awards in order of greatest financial need, applicants further down the rank-order list will generally have lower eligible loan amounts and consequently lower award amounts. The increase in supplemental funding allowed Nurse Corps LRP to make more awards, therefore decreasing the average award amount.

#### (2) Nurse Corps LRP Continuations

In FY 2022, 39 percent of the participants initially awarded in FY 2020 requested a continuation award. The Nurse Corps LRP awarded 208 continuations in FY 2022. Nurse faculty received 12 percent (25) of the continuation awards.

To continue support of APRNs in women's health (women's health NPs and certified nurse midwives) and certified OB/GYN RNs working in eligible CSFs, the Nurse Corps LRP continued its women's health set-aside of up to \$5 million from FY 2021. Nurse Corps LRP made 63 awards to support women's health from annual appropriations and an additional 44 awards from ARP Act funding.

#### (3) FY 2022 Nurse Corps SP Awards

In FY 2022, the Nurse Corps SP made 567 new awards and 25 continuation awards. The average new award was \$103,103. This was a 7 percent increase in the number of new awards and a 0.4 percent increase in the average new award amount from FY 2021 to FY 2022. To increase the supply of RNs with the ability to respond to the growing nursing shortage and other public health crises such as a global pandemic, in FY 2022 the Nurse Corps SP dedicated funding to supporting a career pathway to obtaining a qualifying degree to become an RN. Students with multiple career designations of entry include health professionals such as Certified Nursing Assistants, Home Health Aides, Medical Assistants, Licensed Practical (Vocational) Nurses, and other entry-level health professionals. Nurse Corps SP made 25 awards to eligible scholars from the career pathway set-aside using annual appropriations and an additional 23 awards from ARP Act funding.

#### (4) Average Amount Funded per Year of Service Obligated

HRSA bases new Nurse Corps LRP awards on 2 years of obligated service and caps them at 60 percent of the applicant's total eligible loan amounts. The average new LRP award

amount per year of obligated service was \$18,863 for nurses serving in CSFs and \$20,078 for nurses serving in accredited schools of nursing – a 50 percent decrease and a 47 percent decrease respectively from FY 2021 to FY 2022.<sup>21,22</sup>

HRSA bases Nurse Corps SP awards on 1 year of service for each year of funding with a minimum of 2 years of service. The average new SP award amount per year of obligated service was \$46,424 – a 1 percent decrease from FY 2021 to FY 2022.

#### V. Conclusion

FY 2022 represented the Nurse Corps' highest field strength in the history of the program with a 56 percent increase due to the additional ARP Act funding. The Nurse Corps LRP and SP continue to work towards increasing the number of nurses working in CSFs and teaching in nursing schools across the United States. In FY 2023, the Nurse Corps programs will continue focusing on ensuring Nurse Corps participants serve in areas with the greatest need. Some of the critical activities of the Nurse Corps programs in FY 2022 were increasing the number of APRNs trained in psychiatric mental health and increasing the number of women's health NPs, certified nurse midwives, and certified OB/GYN RNs. The ongoing participation of nurse faculty in the LRP program will also help address upcoming nurse shortages in the future. Through the efforts and accomplishments highlighted in this report, the Nurse Corps programs allow dedicated RNs and APRNs to care for underserved populations in CSFs and provide quality education in schools of nursing with students from disadvantaged backgrounds.

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This data does not include the amount for continuation contracts which would extend the amount paid up to 85 percent of their debt and extend their years of obligated service to 3 years.
