**NURSE CORPS LOAN REPAYMENT AND
SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS
FISCAL YEAR 2024**

Executive Summary

The Nurse Corps Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs report to Congress for fiscal year (FY) 2024 responds to section 846(h) of the Public Health Service Act, which states:

Not later than 18 months after August 1, 2002, and annually thereafter, the Secretary shall prepare and submit to the Congress a report describing the programs carried out under this section, including statements regarding—

- (1) the number of enrollees, scholarships, loan repayments, and grant recipients;*
- (2) the number of graduates;*
- (3) the amount of scholarship payments and loan repayments made;*
- (4) which educational institution the recipients attended;*
- (5) the number and placement location of the scholarship and loan repayment recipients at health care facilities with a critical shortage of nurses;*
- (6) the default rate and actions required;*
- (7) the amount of outstanding default funds of both the scholarship and loan repayment programs;*
- (8) to the extent that it can be determined, the reason for the default;*
- (9) the demographics of the individuals participating in the scholarship and loan repayment programs;*
- (10) justification for the allocation of funds between the scholarship and loan repayment programs; and*
- (11) an evaluation of the overall costs and benefits of the programs.”*

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) administers the Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program (LRP) and the Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (SP) to improve the distribution and supply of nurses. The Nurse Corps LRP and SP support nursing education and training by providing recruitment and retention incentives to nurses committed to a career in underserved communities. These incentives include either a loan repayment or a scholarship award in exchange for service as a nurse at an eligible health care facility with a critical shortage of nurses (also known as a critical shortage facility (CSF)) that is in a health professional shortage area (HPSA),¹ or a loan repayment award for service as nurse faculty at an eligible accredited school of nursing.

In FY 2024, the Nurse Corps programs received \$92.6 million in annual appropriations to further bolster the nursing workforce. HRSA made a total of 1,281 new and continuation Nurse Corps awards to nurses and nursing students across all 50 states, the District of Columbia, U.S. Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico. Specifically:

- The Nurse Corps LRP received 6,787 new and continuation applications and made a total of 1,033 awards. Of the applications received, 5,873 new and 760 continuation applicants were eligible for funding. The Nurse Corps LRP awarded 16 percent of eligible applicants.

¹ A HPSA is a geographic area, population group, or health care facility that has been designated by HRSA as having a shortage of health professionals. For the purpose of Nurse Corps programs, HRSA only uses geographic area and population group HPSAs. HPSA scores range from 1 to 25 for primary care and mental health. The numerical score provided for a HPSA reflects the degree of need (i.e., the higher the score, the greater the need).

- o HRSA made 907 LRP awards to nursing participants serving at CSFs, which included 340 new and 567 continuation awards. Ninety-seven percent of LRP awards at CSFs were in high-need HPSAs (defined as an area with a HPSA score of 14 or higher) with an average HPSA score of 14 in FY 2024.
 - o Additionally, HRSA made 126 awards to nurse faculty participants serving at a school of nursing, which included 37 new and 89 continuation Nurse Corps LRP awards.
- The Nurse Corps SP received 2,997 new and 60 continuation applications and made a total of 248 awards. Of the applications received, 1,154 new applicants and 60 continuation participants were eligible for funding. The Nurse Corps SP awarded 20 percent of eligible applicants.
 - o HRSA made 188 new and 60 continuation Nurse Corps SP awards to nursing students – all of whom demonstrated the greatest financial need.

As of September 30, 2024, the field strength consisted of 2,425 participants, including registered nurses and nurse faculty members fulfilling multi-year service commitments. This represents a 33 percent decrease from the 3,628 participants awarded in FY 2023. The FY 2024 reduction when compared to the FY 2023 field strength reflects the completion of service commitments of clinicians who had earlier contracts funded by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, which provided one-time additional funding of \$200 million. Clinicians are awarded loan repayment contracts in a given year and then complete their service commitment over a multiyear period, depending on the program. They remain in the field strength beyond the initial year when they were funded; therefore, the impact of a reduction in funding is seen in a reduction in field strength in a later year. Based on data collected by HRSA, 90 percent of Nurse Corps alumni remained at a CSF for 2 years beyond the completion of their Nurse Corps service commitment, although these alumni are not included in the calculation of field strength.

I. Legislative Language

Section 846(h) of the Public Health Service (PHS) Act requires that the Secretary provide a report to Congress. The PHS Act states:

“Not later than 18 months after August 1, 2002, and annually thereafter, the Secretary shall prepare and submit to the Congress a report describing the programs carried out under this section, including statements regarding—

- (1) the number of enrollees, scholarships, loan repayments, and grant recipients;*
- (2) the number of graduates;*
- (3) the amount of scholarship payments and loan repayments made;*
- (4) which educational institution the recipients attended;*
- (5) the number and placement location of the scholarship and loan repayment recipients at health care facilities with a critical shortage of nurses;*
- (6) the default rate and actions required;*
- (7) the amount of outstanding default funds of both the scholarship and loan repayment programs;*
- (8) to the extent that it can be determined, the reason for the default;*
- (9) the demographics of the individuals participating in the scholarship and loan repayment programs;*
- (10) justification for the allocation of funds between the scholarship and loan repayment programs; and*
- (11) an evaluation of the overall costs and benefits of the programs.”*

II. Introduction

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) administers the Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program (LRP) and the Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (SP) to improve the distribution and supply of nursing graduates and professionals.

The Nurse Corps LRP is a financial incentive program in which registered nurses (RN) and advanced practice registered nurses (APRN), such as nurse practitioners (NP), with the greatest financial need, enter into contracts with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to work full-time in an approved critical shortage facility (CSF).² LRP repays 60 percent of the outstanding principal and interest on the nursing education loans for participants in exchange for a 2-year service commitment. Participants may be eligible for an additional 25 percent repayment of their original total qualifying educational loan balance in exchange for an optional third year of full-time service.

The Nurse Corps LRP also makes awards to nurses to serve as faculty at accredited schools of nursing. HRSA provides the same loan repayment benefits to nurse faculty as program

participants serving at a CSF. The awards aid in the recruitment and retention of nurse faculty by decreasing economic barriers associated with pursuing a career in academia. Higher compensation in clinical and private sector settings can draw nurse educators away from teaching.³ Furthermore, the American Association of Colleges of Nursing expects the shortage of nurse faculty to increase as current nurse faculty retire.⁴ The average ages of doctoral and master's degree-prepared nurse faculty professors are 61 and 56 years, respectively.⁵

The Nurse Corps SP reduces financial barriers to nursing education for all levels of professional nursing students. Qualified applicants with the greatest financial need receive a funding preference.⁶ HRSA pays tuition and eligible fees directly to the schools; other reasonable costs and a monthly stipend is issued directly to individuals enrolled in an accredited school of nursing, in exchange for a 2-year minimum service commitment in a CSF post-graduation. The "other reasonable costs" is a single annual payment provided to the students to assist with the cost of books, clinical supplies/instruments, and uniforms, while the monthly stipend is to cover living expenses. In fiscal year (FY) 2024, stipends were \$1,599 per month.

The Nurse Corps LRP and Nurse Corps SP work to address the maldistribution of nurses across the United States. Many factors affect the demand of nurses, including population growth, the aging population and that of the nursing workforce, economic conditions, demand for health services broadly and within specific health care settings, and health care reimbursement.⁷ In November 2024, HRSA's National Center for Health Workforce Analysis updated its nursing workforce data, projecting a national shortage of approximately 207,980 full-time equivalent registered nurses by 2037, which represents a 6 percent shortfall. This is a decrease from the previously projected shortage of 337,970 full-time equivalent registered nurses by 2036.

III. Overview

HRSA establishes and publishes Nurse Corps program priorities annually in the Application and Program Guidance for each program. In FY 2024, HRSA set aside up to 90 percent of the Nurse Corps LRP total annual appropriations to support NPs. Within the allocations for NPs, up to 50 percent of the total annual appropriations was available for NPs in primary care CSFs and the remainder was available to all other NPs, including psychiatric NPs.

Additionally, the FY 2024 Nurse Corps LRP and SP continued set-aside funding of up to \$5 million to support women's health for applicants working in one of the following capacities:

women's health NP, certified nurse midwife, or certified obstetrics-gynecology (OB/GYN) RN. The Nurse Corps SP also continued to commit up to \$2 million of FY 2024 funding to support "Career Pathways" students, who are entry-level health professionals seeking degrees to become an RN. To increase the number of RNs and APRNs participating in the programs, the Nurse Corps LRP and SP recruited licensed nurses and students interested in pursuing training as RNs and APRNs, including NPs through outreach efforts to colleges, universities, and associations.

For the Nurse Corps LRP, applicants with the greatest financial need who work in CSFs located in a health professional shortage area (HPSA) with scores of 14 or above receive funding preference.⁸ For the faculty component of the Nurse Corps LRP, preference is given to nurse faculty members with the greatest financial need working at schools of nursing with at least 50 percent enrollment of students from a disadvantaged background. An individual from a disadvantaged background is defined as a student who is considered economically disadvantaged or comes from an environment that has inhibited them from obtaining the knowledge, skills, and abilities required to enroll in and graduate from a health profession or nursing school (environmentally disadvantaged).⁹

In FY 2024, the Nurse Corps SP considered applicants with the greatest financial need, based on the applicant's student aid index as determined by the U.S. Department of Education to receive a funding preference. Among qualified applicants with the greatest financial need, HRSA makes awards considering the following:

- Enrollment or acceptance in an accredited diploma or undergraduate and graduate nursing program or an accredited graduate-level NP program, including NPs specializing in psychiatric mental health, with full-time or part-time registration for consecutive terms.
- Enrollment or acceptance in an accredited Doctor of Nursing Practice program, a program for certified nurse midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetists, clinical nurse specialists, or psychology specialists, with full-time registration for consecutive terms.

This report summarizes Nurse Corps LRP and Nurse SP activities for FY 2024 and provides information on the following, in accordance with section 846(h) of the PHS Act:

- Number of enrollees, scholarships, loan repayments, and grant recipients;
- Number of graduates;
- Amount of scholarship awards and loan repayments made;
- Educational institution attended;
- Number and placement location of Nurse Corps LRP and SP recipients at CSFs;
- Default rate and actions required;
- Amount of outstanding default funds for both the Nurse Corps LRP and SP;
- Reason for default, to the extent that it can be determined;
- Demographics of the individuals taking part in the Nurse Corps LRP and SP;

- Justification for the allocation of funds between Nurse Corps LRP and SP; and
- Evaluation of the costs and benefits of the programs.

IV. Report Requirements

Requirement #1: The Number of Enrollees, Scholarships, Loan Repayments, and Grant Recipients

Nurse Corps Field Strength

In FY 2024, there were 2,425 Nurse Corps participants serving at approximately 1,734 CSFs and schools of nursing and providing care to 2.4 million patients in the United States. Over 150 Nurse Corps faculty members trained the next generation of nurses. About 14 percent of Nurse Corps clinicians worked at a Federally Qualified Health Center.¹⁰

HRSA made 1,033 Nurse Corps LRP awards, including 377 new and 656 continuation awards. (Table 1). The 1,033 awards were provided to RNs (360 awards; 35 percent), NPs (436 awards; 42 percent), certified registered nurse anesthetists (66 awards; 6 percent), certified nurse midwives (43 awards; 4 percent), clinical nurse specialists (2 awards, 0.2 percent) and nurse faculty (126 awards; 12 percent).¹¹

HRSA made 248 Nurse Corps SP awards, including 188 new and 60 continuation awards. HRSA made two new Nurse Corps SP awards with no-year funds (Table 2). The 248 awards were to associate degree students (14 awards; 6 percent), bachelor’s degree students (73 awards; 29 percent), bachelor’s accelerated students (62 awards; 25 percent), master’s degree students (63 awards; 26 percent), post-graduate certificate students (2 awards; 0.8 percent) and Doctor of Nursing practice students (33 awards; 13 percent).¹²

Requirement #2: The Number of Graduates

Nurse Corps SP participants may enroll in diploma programs as well as accredited associate, bachelor's, and master's degree programs. The minimum service requirement is 2 years, with a maximum of 4 years of full-time service, in a CSF depending on the number of years of academic support. Participants can choose from 1 to 4 years of scholarship support, consisting of payments for tuition and fees, other reasonable costs, and a monthly stipend.

Nurse Corps SP participants may work part-time to fulfill their service obligation. However, HRSA will extend the service obligation years of service so that the aggregate amount of service performed is equivalent to the full-time option. Nurse Corps SP graduates have up to 9 months from the date of graduation to obtain a nursing license, accept an offer of employment from a program-approved facility, and begin full-time or part-time clinical services at a CSF. The number of active Nurse Corps SP participants who graduated in FY 2024 is 433. Of those participants, 134 served in a CSF, 297 sought employment at a CSF and two participants were reported to be in a nursing residency. In FY 2024, 90 percent of Nurse Corps alumni remained at a CSF for 2 years beyond the completion of their Nurse Corps service commitment.

Requirement #3: The Amount of Scholarship Payments and Loan Repayments Made

Table 3 below contains amounts paid for Nurse Corps LRP and SP new awards and continuations, funded from annual appropriations (base funds), and no-year funds.

Requirement #4: The Educational Institutions Attended by Recipients¹³

Nurse Corps SP participants attended 155 schools in 35 states, including the District of Columbia (these numbers include all Nurse Corps scholars awarded in the prior FY). Appendix B illustrates the distribution of FY 2024 new awards by state and educational institution.

Requirement #5: The Number and Placement Location of the Scholarship and Loan Repayment Recipients at Healthcare Facilities with a Critical Shortage of Nurses

Except for nurse faculty, all Nurse Corps LRP and SP participants are required to serve at a CSF. Nurse faculty participants must serve at an eligible accredited school of nursing. The following types of facilities are eligible CSFs for placement of Nurse Corps LRP and SP participants:

Hospitals and other CSFs:

- Disproportionate share hospital
- Public hospital
- Private hospital¹⁴
- Urgent care center
- Ambulatory surgical center
- End stage renal disease dialysis center
- Hospice program
- Residential nursing home

Primary Care Settings:

- Federally Qualified Health Center
- Community mental health center¹⁵
- Rural health clinic
- State or local health department
- Small rural hospital¹⁶
- Outpatient facility
- American Indian health facility
- Home health agency
- School-based clinic
- Nurse managed health clinic/center
- Native Hawaiian health center
- Free and charitable clinic

In FY 2024, 907 Nurse Corps LRP new and continuation awardees served in 706 CSFs in 47 states, as well as the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico (Appendix C); 126 nurse faculty new and continuation awardees served in 111 schools of nursing in 38 states and the District of Columbia (Appendix D). In FY 2024, 134 Nurse Corps SP new graduates served in 116 CSFs in 32 states, and the District of Columbia (Appendix A).

Requirement #6: Default Rate and Actions Required

In FY 2024, there were no participants who defaulted in Nurse Corps programs.

HRSA expresses the Nurse Corps LRP and SP default rates as the percentage of participants in a cohort (all participants with a new or continuation contract awarded in an FY) who defaulted (number of participants who have defaulted divided by the total number of individuals in the cohort).¹⁷ Individuals often participate for multiple years; however, HRSA calculates default rates based on the FY in which an individual received the initial award.

The maximum amount of time a participant in full-time service may be in the Nurse Corps SP is 8 years (4 years in school and 4 years of obligated service). The maximum amount of time a participant in full-time service may be in the Nurse Corps LRP is 3 years (2 years of service under an initial contract and 1 optional year of service under a continuation). Participants with periods of approved suspension of service may require an additional 1 to 2 years of monitoring. Participants in the Nurse Corps SP wishing to serve part-time must obtain prior approval from Nurse Corps SP and must extend the service obligation to equal the full-time commitment. Thus, HRSA reports default rates over 10 years for the Nurse Corps SP and 5 years for the Nurse Corps LRP to provide an accurate picture of default rates. Historically, few to no defaults occur within the first year of the service obligation.

Participants who breach their contracts are placed in default and are liable to repay the Nurse Corps LRP or SP funds they received, plus interest, from the date of the default, which is defined as the date the participant breached the Nurse Corps contract service obligation or, for scholars still in school, the date they left their educational program as described in section 846(g)(1)(A) of the PHS Act. Participants must pay the total amount owed, including interest, within 3 years of the date of default. The interest rate is the maximum legal prevailing rate for the applicable quarter determined and fixed by the Secretary of the Treasury after taking into consideration private consumer rates of interest. The Nurse Corps LRP and SP work with participants placed in default by helping them to satisfy their debts through service when possible. In FY 2024, five participants who were previously in default were granted an opportunity to return to service. Of the five participants, one participant was from the Nurse Corps LRP, and four participants were from the Nurse Corps SP. All five participants fulfilled the necessary requirements to resolve their default status and, as a result, are no longer in default.

As of September 30, 2024, there were a total of 153 defaults in the Nurse Corps SP from FY 2014 to FY 2024.

Requirement #7: Amount of Outstanding Default Funds of Both the Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs

Section 846(g)(4) of the PHS Act authorizes amounts recovered from participants who breach their Nurse Corps LRP or SP contract to be made available for the respective program until expended. HRSA uses these funds for new awards, continuations, and modifications to existing contracts. In FY 2024, the Nurse Corps LRP added \$662,443 to its no-year account and closed the FY with a net amount of \$329,162 although Nurse Corps LRP did make eight awards from the no-year account. In FY 2024, the Nurse Corps SP added \$34,637.56 to its no-year account and closed the FY with a net amount of \$53,925.95.

As of September 30, 2024, the total outstanding default debt was \$3,965,776.94 for the Nurse Corps LRP and \$17,977,291.67 for the Nurse Corps SP.

Requirement #8: The Reasons for the Default

While there were no defaults in FY 2024, historically the most common reasons for default in the Nurse Corps SP have been participants failure to complete their service obligation, academic dismissal, or withdrawal from school.

Requirement #9: The Demographics of the Individuals Participating in the Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs

Nurse Corps LRP and SP participants self-report demographic data. Participants may choose to report on any of these demographic areas as a whole or in part. Of the Nurse Corps participants who reported on sex, race, and ethnicity, the most reported sex was female, and the most reported ethnicity was White. Black or African American was the largest reported

underrepresented group demographic (Table 8). The Nurse Corps captures race and ethnicity data separately in the electronic application. Participants report Hispanic/Latino and Non-Hispanic/Non-Latino ethnicity data separately from race data. As a result, the Hispanic/Latino and Non-Hispanic/Non-Latino ethnicity data may be over-reported because participants can report it in both the race and ethnicity sections.

Requirement #10: Justification for the Allocation of Funds between the Loan Repayment and Scholarship Programs

Historically, HRSA has allocated between 67-75 percent of the total Nurse Corps funds for the LRP and 25-33 percent for the SP. The LRP is designed to support licensed nurses who are working at CSFs and can readily supply available and qualified nurses to areas in need of their service. In FY 2024, the Nurse Corps programs received \$92.6 million in annual appropriations. Of the \$92.6 million in annual appropriations, HRSA designated \$77.9 million for the Nurse Corps LRP and SP awards, consisting of \$51.9 million allocated to LRP awards (67 percent of HRSA allocation) and \$25.9 million to SP awards (33 percent of HRSA allocation). The remaining \$14.7 million directly supported the Nurse Corps programs in the form of staffing and acquisition contracts, including the electronic system used to process program applications and

monitor awarded participants, tax withholding and reporting, and other administrative obligations.

Requirement #11: An Evaluation of the Overall Costs and Benefits of the Programs

Analysis of costs per years of service:

(1) FY 2024 Nurse Corps LRP Awards

In FY 2024, HRSA made 377 new awards, representing a 23 percent decrease in new awards from the 492 made in FY 2023. This decrease in new awards was due to no remaining American Rescue Plan Act funding and the increase in award amounts. The average new award amount for Nurse Corps LRP participants was \$96,007 for nurses serving in CSFs and \$82,679 for nurses serving in accredited schools of nursing. This is a 5 percent increase in the average new award amount for nurses serving in CSFs and an 8 percent decrease in the average new award amount for nurses serving in accredited schools of nursing from FY 2023 to 2024. The Nurse Corps LRP awards larger amounts to applicants with the highest financial need, so making more awards leads to smaller average award amounts, while fewer awards results in higher averages.

(2) Nurse Corps LRP Continuations

In FY 2024, 29 percent of the participants initially awarded in FY 2023 requested a continuation award. The Nurse Corps LRP awarded 656 continuations in FY 2024. Nurse faculty received 89 (14 percent) continuation awards.

To continue support of APRNs in women's health (women's health NPs and certified nurse midwives) and certified OB/GYN RNs working in eligible CSFs, the Nurse Corps LRP continued its women's health set-aside of up to \$5 million from FY 2024. Nurse Corps LRP made 79 (58 new and 21 continuation) awards to support women's health from annual appropriations.

(3) FY 2024 Nurse Corps SP Awards

In FY 2024, the Nurse Corps SP made 188 new awards and 60 continuation awards. The average new award was \$130,209. This represented a 36 percent decrease in the number of new awards and a 12 percent increase in the average new award amount from FY 2023 to FY 2024. To increase the supply of RNs with the ability to respond to the growing nursing shortage, in FY 2024 the Nurse Corps SP dedicated funding to supporting a career pathway to obtaining a qualifying degree to become an RN. Students with multiple career designations of entry-level health professions training include health professionals such as certified nursing assistants, home health aides, medical assistants, and licensed practical (vocational) nurses. Nurse Corps SP made 22 new and continuation awards to eligible scholars from the career pathway set-aside using annual appropriations.

(4) Average Amount Funded Per Year of Service Obligated

HRSA bases new Nurse Corps awards on 2 years of obligated service and caps them at 60 percent of the applicant's total eligible loan amounts. The average new award amount per year of obligated service was \$48,004 for nurses serving in CSFs and \$41,339 for nurses serving in accredited schools of nursing – a 5 percent increase in the award amount per year for nurses serving at a CSF and 8 percent decrease for nurses serving in accredited schools of nursing from FY 2023 to FY 2024.^{19,20}

HRSA bases Nurse Corps SP awards on 1 year of service for each year of funding with a minimum of 2 years of service. The average new SP award amount per year of obligated service was \$56,689.05 – a 9 percent increase from FY 2023 to FY 2024.

V. Conclusion

The Nurse Corps LRP and SP contribute to increasing the number of nurses working in CSFs and teaching in nursing schools across the United States. In FY 2024, the Nurse Corps programs will continue focusing on ensuring Nurse Corps participants serve in areas with the greatest need. Some of the critical activities of the Nurse Corps programs in FY 2024 were maintaining set-aside funding levels to APRNs trained in psychiatric mental health and increasing the number of women's health NPs, certified nurse midwives, and certified OB/GYN RNs. The ongoing participation of nurse faculty in the LRP program will also help address upcoming nurse shortages in the future. Through the efforts and accomplishments highlighted in this report, the Nurse Corps programs allow dedicated RNs and APRNs to care for underserved populations in CSFs and provide quality education in schools of nursing with students from disadvantaged backgrounds.
